

Click the Red arrow. This will then bring you to a page with the list of names in your group booking. Please select YOUR name and continue to follow the prompts. You will be asked some questions regarding transporting dangerous goods as well as your luggage. In order to alleviate some stress at the airport I strongly urge people to pay for their luggage and their ski/snowboard bags at this time.

For those who have the Delta APP you can also check in there.



GETTING THERE ...

- Suggested arrival time is at least 2 hours prior to departure.
- Please be sure all checked items have a name tag with the destination labeled (DEN/DTW).
- Baggage Fees
 - Carry-on Free – May not exceed 45 linear inches (114 cm) in combined length, width and height including handle and wheels. Size limit is 22" x 14" x 9" (56 x 35 x 23 cm)
 - First bag under 50 lbs. (23kg) \$30.00US one way
 - Second bag under 50 lbs. (23kg) \$40.00US one way
 - Overweight bags – 51-70 lbs (23-31.75 kg) \$100.00US one way
 - Ski and snowboard equipment are allowed as checked bags. One ski/pole bag or one snowboard bag and one boot bag is accepted per person. If the combined weight is over 50lbs, the applicable excess weight fee will be charged. It has been recommended to us to insulate your skis or snowboard with turtle necks, sweaters and other clothing to protect the tips, tails and bindings.
- Delta Airlines in Detroit and Denver are “cashless stations”. Credit card payments only.
- Don't forget your passport! Government-issued picture identification is required at check-in. Please have your ID handy at the airport.

Gray Line shuttle will take us from the Denver airport to Steamboat. The drive time is approximately 3 hours and 46 minutes. We will be making a “quick” 30-minute grocery and liquor stop en route at King Soopers Supermarket and Applejack Wine and Spirits. Please only get the necessities as we are limited to time and room on the bus. There are several liquor and grocery stores near the resort.



HISTORY OF STEAMBOAT

ORIGINS

The name of Steamboat Springs is thought to have originated around the early 1800s when French trappers thought they heard the chugging sound of a steamboat's steam engine. The sound turned out to be a natural mineral spring, to be named the Steamboat Spring.

FIRST RESIDENTS

In 1874, James Crawford ventured into the Yampa Valley seeking a homestead site. Impressed by the region's mineral waters, he built a cabin near present day Iron Spring and a log shelter over the nearby hot springs. Crawford spent a few of his winters in Boulder, Colorado where he persuaded several prominent businessmen to join him in organizing the Steamboat Springs Townsite Company in 1884. By 1885, five other families had settled in the area including a newspaperman, James Hoyle, who brought his printing press and publication of the Steamboat Pilot began that same year. The area began to develop slowly but increased slightly when a sawmill was established in 1883.

BECOMING A TOWN

In 1900, the town was incorporated with James Crawford as the first mayor. By 1902, the town had 3 hotels, 3 livery stables, 3 banks, 4 general stores, 2 meat markets, and other businesses including the Steamboat Springs Service Company. This company was the community's first electric utility company.

RAILROAD

In 1909, the railroad arrived, which sparked a boom for the commercial industry in Steamboat Springs. Ranching was the primary industry of the valley and the cattle ranchers turned the new railroad depot into one of the largest cattle shipping centers of the West. Consequently, the construction of the railroad silenced the Steamboat Spring's chugging noise forever. Numerous passengers began arriving on the railroad to visit the scenic area and the natural mineral springs. In the early 1910s, Norwegian Carl Howelsen arrived and brought ski jumping to the area and established skiing as a sport. Tourists now also began to visit the area for skiing and a few avid skiers began to look for broader areas of terrain.

RECREATIONAL DESTINATION

In the 1960s, Storm Mountain was developed as a resort ski mountain led by James Temple. The mountain was later named Mt. Werner in memory of local skier and Olympian Buddy Werner who was tragically killed in an avalanche. Celebrating its western heritage and ranching traditions, Steamboat Springs thrives as a world-class skiing, biking, and year-round recreational destination.

MOUNTAIN STATS

Steamboat is actually a complete mountain range: Mount Werner, Sunshine Peak, Storm Peak, Thunderhead Peak, Pioneer Ridge, and Christie Peak. 2,965 acres (1200 hectares) of permitted terrain offer a diversity of trails for all levels of ability. Gladed areas of Pioneer Ridge, Sunshine and Storm Peak are Steamboat's particular claim to fame, with legendary Champagne Powder® snow in the trees for the most avid powder hounds.



The Lodge at Steamboat is a wonderful condominium resort and a Steamboat landmark located at the base of the Steamboat Ski Area. The Lodge is designed to embrace the mountain setting and makes an ideal home-away-from-home for any alpine retreat to relish the fresh powder on the slopes.

Each condo has either two or three bedrooms, with a bathroom for each. Fully equipped kitchens come standard. Patios/balconies are also a standard feature. Free Wi-Fi is also accessible in each condo and in the clubhouse. The Lodge also features four outdoor and one indoor hot tub. The front desk conveniently located at the entrance to the property in a clubhouse makes a great place to meet up once everyone is awake and ready to start the day.

The Lodge is located about two blocks along a flat sidewalk to the base of the ski area. There is a designated shuttle that loops back and forth from the clubhouse to the ski area all day. The property also hosts ski lockers.

There is a small market and deli, coffee shop and Brew House located next door to the property. If you need to rent skis, there is also a Christy Sports location next door, making it very convenient to pick up or switch out equipment.

The Outlaw Mountain Coaster is the longest coaster in North America at more than 6,280 linear feet. The track near Christie Peak Express descends more than 400 vertical feet, rises up to 40 feet above the ground, and features, dips, waves, turns and 360-degree circles. Riders travel at speeds up to 43 kph. The cost is \$20.00 per ride or \$59.00 for an unlimited pass.

Zephyr Helicopter Tours



Fish Creek Falls

Clear and fresh high alpine water roars down Fish Creek Canyon, spilling over the magnificent 280-ft Fish Creek Falls, one of the most popular destinations around Steamboat Springs. Just 3 miles from downtown Steamboat, wilderness comes to life with a splash at the legendary falls. A short 1/4-mile walk down a gravel path is a pristine view of the lower falls, while a moderate hike with picturesque views will take the more adventurous to Upper Fish Creek Falls and Long Lake, deep in the Routt National Forest. Directions from Lincoln Avenue (highway 40): go north on 3rd Street then a right on Fish Creek Falls Road. Four miles to the parking lot and trailhead. 34165 Fish Creek Falls Road. Open daily 6:00am – 10:00pm. There is a \$5 cash vehicle day use fee.

STEAMBOAT FUN FACTS!

- * Champagne Powder – The phrase “champagne powder” was coined in the early 1950s by local rancher Joe McElroy, who was out skiing on terrain that eventually would become the ski area and said the snow tickled his nose like champagne. Steamboat’s unique snow averages 6 percent water content. Compare that to the 15 percent water content more typical at other locations. No other ski resort has its snow trademarked, and there’s no other place you’ll find Champagne Powder!
- * The street through the heart of town was designed wide enough for ranchers to be able to drive their herds of cattle through.
- * Some Steamboat businesses offer a “powder clause” to employees, allowing them to come into work late if the 5:00am snow report says it has snowed 6” or more at mid-mountain!
- * Steamboat is Dog Town USA. At least one dog is present in 50% of Steamboat’s households.
- * Duncan Draper is a Steamboat ski patroller who looks after Powder the 130-pound St. Bernard safety dog. Draper has worked at Steamboat for 26 years.



STEAMBOAT LOCAL JARGON

- Bail** – Falling intentionally to avoid a crash
- Bomber** – Skiing/snowboarding recklessly down a slope without turning
- Boosters** – Small kicker ramps found around the ski area
- Gnar** – Deep fluffy snow, perfect for powder skiing
- Gondie** – Gondola
- Jerry** – Someone who is clueless in both fashion sense and skiing ability
- Lipstick laps** – Skiing/snowmobiling while wearing lipstick
- Rook** – Amateur
